

Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the central celebration of Christianity – the Eucharist.

In today's gospel, the author of Luke's gospel was keen to show that the reign of God is available to anyone who wishes to be a part of it. In the feeding of the five thousand with five loaves and two fish there is a clear example of God's presence in a miraculous meal.

It is significant that in the provision of the loaves and fish Jesus himself does not deal directly with the crowd. He leaves the distribution entirely to the disciples. Jesus is apprenticing them to be ministers of the hospitality of God. This story foreshadows the Christian Eucharist – in which we all experience and celebrate God's hospitality.

During this weekend many young people will experience the hospitality of God as they receive their First Communion – let us continue to pray that we will all be ministers of hospitality.
