The Catholic Education Office is in the final stages of drafting the latest Reconciliation Action Plan (2021-2023) to be launched once approved by Reconciliation Australia and this Action Plan will be complemented by a Reconciliation Artwork commissioned from Howard Butler, a proud Gooreng Gooreng, Gangalu, Yiman man. CEO staff have participated in a comprehensive survey and engagement process to assist in refining the Plan. My thanks to members of the RAP Committee for leading us in a proactive commitment to better understand and value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, histories and spiritualities.

As you are aware, 2021 is a significant year for Catholic Education in Australia as we mark 200 years since the first Catholic school was founded in Parramatta, NSW. On Monday May 24, the solemnity of Our Lady Help of Christians, a Diocesan Mass will be held at 12noon in St Joseph's Cathedral with Bishop Michael presiding. This Mass will be live streamed throughout the Diocese and all Catholic schools are warmly invited to join the live stream and participate in our major celebration to mark the 200 years of Catholic Education in Australia. My sincere appreciation is extended to all those who participated in the video production of John Burland's, *Mary Help of Christians*, to assist all in our communities learn this song in preparation for the Mass. The video is in final stages of production and will soon be made available to schools.





Pope Francis calls for Global Prayer Marathon for the month of May. Pope Francis has called for a global prayer marathon for the entire month of May, praying for the end to the pandemic. The theme will be ‘from the entire church an unceasing prayer rises to God’ and will be held throughout the month of May. Each day in May, there will be a livestream from one of 30 chosen Marian shrines or sanctuaries to guide the prayer at 6:00pm Rome time on all Vatican media platforms. The pope will open the month-long prayer on 1 May and conclude on 31 May. Each day of the month has a different prayer intention related to the pandemic. For instance, the 17 May intention is “for all world leaders and for all heads of international organizations.” That prayer will be celebrated at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington.
