

History Snippet: Following the death of Bishop Shiel in 1931, Romuald Hayes was appointed the fifth Bishop and the first Australian born bishop for the Diocese, coming from Melbourne. It was during Bishop Hayes's time that more schools were to open. In Rockhampton the Presentation Sisters opened St Peter's in 1934 while the Sisters of Mercy opened St Therese's (now the site of Centacare) in Rockhampton. In Mackay St Francis Xavier opened in Mackay in 1935 and two years later St Joseph's North Mackay commenced as a church – school. The convent school in Farleigh (St Brigid's) followed in 1939. In Gladstone the demand for secondary education led to efforts to open a high school, but at this stage did not eventuate. Meanwhile in Bundaberg the Brisbane Sisters of Mercy remained even though Bundaberg was now part of the Rockhampton Diocese. Meanwhile the Sisters of Mercy opened a school in Biloela in 1939 and the Presentation Sisters in Monto in 1940. Both schools also offered boarding accommodation.
