Faith in the future

History Snippet: The Second World War had a major impact on the communities of the Diocese. Following the 1941 attack on Pearl Harbour emergency measures were taken and some schools did not reopen for a few weeks at the beginning of 1942. The boarding section of the Range Convent Rockhampton was evacuated for the whole year to the Sisters of Mercy Convent in Barcaldine. By 1945 there were roughly 40 schools within the Diocese and around 4900 students with a number of schools being small and a marked decline in numbers of enrolments in the western regions.
