Single-use plastics ban: Schools are reminded that the ban on single-use plastic items takes effect from 1 September 2021. The [legislation](#), passed earlier this year, bans the sale or supply of straws, cutlery, bowls, plates, stirrers and expanded polystyrene takeaway food containers and cups. An exemption applies for schools to ensure students and staff with disability or healthcare needs can access banned items if needed while at school or during school activities.
