Good morning everyone

I trust the return to school of students this week has gone smoothly. I know so much effort was put in by a great many people to ensure all was in readiness for the return of students. It has been delightful to hear the wonderful stories of our students returning to face to face learning this week and the warm welcome our kindergarten, school and college communities have provided to our families. Thank you to each of you, as you continue to be the compassionate face of Christ to all who encounter our Catholic school communities. I hope you will enjoy the year ahead as part of our Catholic Education family.

The Opening School Year Masses usually held around the Diocese at this time are undoubtedly a much-anticipated celebration. Sadly, these in-person gatherings were not able to go ahead at the present time. Some of our communities were able to celebrate Mass via livestream and my heartfelt congratulations to all involved in coordinating these uplifting celebrations. I am sure we will all be looking forward to safely gathering later when restrictions allow us to come together in prayer.

Last Friday you would have received an All Staff [Bulletin](#) from me outlining information about the four weeks of our school year (7 February to 4 March). I would ask that you take the time to read and understand the information provided so you are fully aware of our processes and practices during this time as we look to protect your health and wellbeing and that of our students. Please contact your principal with any concerns or queries.

In that spirit, I would like to thank all staff who are exercising best practice in monitoring their health and abiding by all recommendations around work attendance. Together with testing, these are two critical defences in limiting the spread of COVID in our communities. The Queensland State Government has provided limited supplies of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) to schools to assist staff and students, who are displaying symptoms, meet the recommendation to access a COVID test. Our kindergartens, primary schools and colleges are also attempting to source RATs from a variety of suppliers to be available to assist in return to work for staff who develop symptoms. In addition, education staff who present at Queensland Health testing clinics will be given priority access to testing. Thank you for your continued efforts in keeping our communities healthy.

Safer Internet Day was held on Tuesday and my congratulations to all those who participated in the worthwhile activities promoted through this eSafety Commissioner initiative. This year's focus, *Play it Fair Online*, calls on internet users to make life online enjoyable by being kind and respectful to each other. 
