THE BISHOP'S MESSAGE

First Reading:

Jeremiah 17:5-8

Jeremiah's prophecy is uncompromising and must have challenged his hearers. Trusting in God alone rather than in human strength and wealth can seem like madness, but we are invited to do just that.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 1:1-4

Happy are they who hope in the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:12. 16-20

Paul says that without Christ's resurrection, his teaching makes no sense. Either we live and die by this, or we are simply talking nonsense. That is the challenge of faith.

Gospel: Luke 6:17.20-26

Luke's Beatitudes are more uncompromising than those of Matthew. We don't have the get-out clause here of being blessed if we are "poor in spirit". It is poverty, pure and simple, that is blessed. The challenge for us is to dare to believe.



PRIEST'S REFLECTION

The choice is ours, God or something else?

Jesus comforts the poor and the hungry saying that they will experience the love of God more abundantly than those who feel delighted in their earthly riches and possessions. The Magnificat of Mary is being fulfilled by the promise of Jesus, our Lord. Thus, Luke makes an important statement that those who trust in God will be the first in the kingdom of God than those with power and possession in the earthly society. What is more interesting is that Jesus calls all those people blessed who, by the worldly standard, are either marginalized or forgotten or cursed. He describes the ordinary people blessed as earthly pleasures give us only fleeting joy. The perspective with which Jesus looks at the poor and the downtrodden, thus, challenges us to examine our way of Christian life.

We pray for a deeper understanding of what Jesus asks of us. His standards are very high. They make great demands of us. We won't always be able to live up to the standards Jesus has given us, but it's for that we should strive. We live in an age when there is so much confusion in our world. We pray that we might have generosity, courage and the love of truth to follow the way of Christ.
