Good morning everyone

The flood devastation experienced by those in Southeast Queensland and in New South Wales is heartbreaking. I had previously provided you details of the <u>Vinnies Flood Appeal</u> – I would also commend to you the <u>Diocese of Lismore 2022 Flood Appeal</u> as a direct way to assist those in our extended Catholic Education family in a region which has suffered the full brunt of the disaster. Please give generously where you can as we keep these communities in our thoughts and prayers, that they will be sustained by the kindness of others.

I was very pleased to attend a Regional Education Roundtable Meeting this week, with Rockhampton Principals and sector stakeholders hosted by the Hon Michelle Landry MP, Federal Member for Capricornia, and the Hon Fiona Nash, Regional Education Commissioner. Discussions centred on the issues, solutions, and possible opportunities within the education sector in our region and what steps could be implemented to improve education outcomes in regional Australia. This round of consultation comes as Commissioner Nash, Australia's first Regional Education Commissioner, rolls out the Australian Government's response to recommendations from the Napthine Review and Halsey Review into Regional, Rural and Remote Education. I will look to communicate any key milestones as the project develops.

This week, representatives from our Primary Schools and Colleges participated in training with Berry Street to further develop trauma-aware practices within schools and improve overall student wellbeing. We commenced our partnership with Berry Street last year and feedback from participants has been extremely positive. I extend my sincere thanks to Brett Halter (Student Services Manager), Erin Sheldrick (Student Wellbeing Project Officer) and the Student Services team for their work in facilitating this valuable training for our staff.

Also, during this current fortnight, two cohorts comprising thirty-seven staff are participating in the Graduate Certificate in Education – Safeguarding Children and Young People. This course is facilitated in partnership with ACU and fully sponsored by Catholic Education – Diocese of Rockhampton. My sincere thanks to staff for their commitment to ongoing learning and professional development in Student Protection and Safeguarding.

Catholic School Parents Queensland (CSPQ), our peak parent body for our school Parents and Friends Associations, marks their 60-year anniversary this weekend. CSPQ works to assist parent engagement in all our schools and advocates strongly for parents in Catholic schools with State and Federal Governments in areas such as funding, curriculum, health, child safety and road safety. CSPQ Executive Director, Mrs Carmel Nash OAM, has been a great friend to Catholic Education in our diocese and has worked tirelessly over many years for our parent bodies. We extend our congratulations to Carmel and all in CSPQ for reaching this significant milestone and offer our great appreciation for the tremendous support and collegiality we have been fortunate to receive over the last 60 years.

I am very much looking forward to attending the annual St Patrick's Day Races at Callaghan Park in Rockhampton this Saturday. In addition to being a very enjoyable event for the local community, the Race Day is a fund raiser for Catholic Primary Schools in the Rockhampton region. Catholic Education is pleased to be associated with the St Patrick's Race Day as it also celebrates the lives of the thousands of Irish people who travelled across the seas to Australia and who made such a significant contribution to the foundation and development of Catholic education in our Diocese and beyond.

This year one of the races will be named in honour of Terry Molloy, a great friend of Catholic Education, who passed away last year. Terry was a long serving member of the St Patrick's Day Race Club and his valued contribution to the Club and to the wider Rockhampton community earned him the respect and admiration of all who had the privilege to know him. It is very fitting that Terry's daughter, Maria Learmonth, who is a staff member at The Cathedral College, will be in attendance at the Race Day.

Finally, to all involved in our Raceday events this weekend - St Patrick's Day Races in Rockhampton, and our Catholic Schools Raceday in Bundaberg - I extend my heartfelt thanks for your hard work in hosting these significant community events and wish all a very successful day. God bless,
