Good morning everyone

This week I joined our school Principals via zoom for the annual Principals' Gathering. A highlight of the Gathering was the excellent and insightful presentations from our guest speakers including Erin Sheldrick (Student Wellbeing Project Officer) and Allahna Heywood (Counselling Services Officer) on Trauma Responsive Communication; highly respected teacher educator Bronwyn Ryrie-Jones (QELi) on Formative Assessment; and Dr Teresa Brown and Associate Professor Robyn Horner from Australian Catholic University on Catholic Identity Recontextualisation. I extend my thanks to Michael Kelso (Assistant Director: Schools Rockhampton Region) for his work in coordinating this year's Gathering.

The Mass of Chrism will be celebrated at St Joseph's Cathedral in Rockhampton on Thursday, 31 March at 10:00am. Bishop Michael has invited all in the Diocese to attend in person or via livestream for this solemn occasion in the lead up to Easter to witness the blessing of Oils. The Chrism Mass coincides with the annual gathering of all our Priests in the Diocese, and I ask that you join with me in praying that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide and strengthen Bishop Michael and our priests in their ministry.

Our 2022 Bishop's Inservice Day will be held next Friday, 1 April via livestream link. For the first time, all our Catholic Education communities will be gathering simultaneously marking an historic milestone for our Diocese, as we build on the success of our 2021 livestreamed event. The focus of the Day this year is the Religious Life of the School exploring the four interrelated components of Religious Identity and Culture, Evangelization and Faith Formation, Prayer and Worship, and Social Action and Justice. A program for the day is available via the Staff Portal and schools will have received a QR code for registration and information regarding workshops for your respective locations. Please ensure you have responded accordingly as this is important for attendance records and accreditation purposes.

I know a great deal of planning has been undertaken to create an experience that is worthwhile and engaging as you gather in your school communities. I thank all who have been involved in organizing the Bishop's Inservice Day this year especially AD: Mission, Kellie Jenkinson and her FIARE team. I also take this opportunity to thank you in advance for your participation and attention and I am sure you will find the Day of significant benefit to your professional development and faith formation. I am particularly grateful to Bishop Michael, our chief shepherd, for the gift of the Bishop's Inservice Day and for generously giving of his time to be with us and to share his wisdom with our school communities on the Day.

As the war continues in Ukraine, Bishop Michael has invited us all to join today's 12.10pm Mass at St Joseph's Cathedral in Rockhampton, in person or via livestream link. The special call to prayer is in response to Pope Francis's appeal to every community and every one of the faithful to unite on March 25 as he consecrates both Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

This week is Harmony Week celebrating Australia's cultural diversity and advancing inclusiveness, respect, and a sense of belonging for everyone. My thanks to all who have conducted Harmony Week activities within their school communities for your great work in building awareness and understanding of this important celebration.

On Wednesday of this week, the Prime Minister, the Hon. Scott Morrison MP and the Deputy Prime Minister, the Hon. Barnaby Joyce MP visited Rockhampton. Bishop Michael and I were invited to attend a gathering with Mr Morrison and Mr Joyce. We took the opportunity to brief the PM and Deputy PM on some of the wonderful initiatives happening in Catholic Education in this Diocese and to raise with them some of the challenges we are experiencing as a provider of Catholic Education Services in a regional and rural area.

I was humbled to be invited by the Executive Director of the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC), Ms Jacinta Collins to Chair a National Gathering of Catholic Education Directors that was held yesterday. The Agenda for the Gathering contained issues of significant importance to Catholic Education in our Diocese with Policy matters impacting on Regional, Rural and Remote Catholic Education organizations being a focus of the discussions. Other issues canvassed at the Gathering included strategies to be adopted by NCEC and Catholic Education providers throughout Australia in the lead up to the forthcoming Federal Election.
