### Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Sunday

**The Harvest is Plentiful,  
but the labourers are few** (Matt 9:37)

**Get up! Stand up! Show up!**

Every year, on the first Sunday in July, Catholics come together across Australia to acknowledge and celebrate the gifts of Australia's First Peoples. This year our theme challenges us all into action.

As we celebrate this special day, non-indigenous people are asked to listen to First Nations people, stand with them, and walk with them on their journey for change. Support is vital to help them amplify their messages to leaders to generate meaningful change!

First Nations Catholics are the youngest and fastest growing demographic in the Australian Catholic Church. While the total Catholic population declines, the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics continues to increase. In 16 dioceses in Australia over 20% of the First Nations population identify as Catholic.

The Central West Cluster of Catholic Parishes encompasses the traditional lands of many First Nations peoples, including the Bidjara, Birria, Dharawala, Iningai, Kuungkari, Kuruwali, Maiawali, Mithaka, Miyan, Pitta-Pitta, Wangkamana, Yagalingu, Yilba and Yirandali peoples. We acknowledge their wisdom, spirituality and connection to their traditional lands.

## RPC Meeting Summary

A short summary of last weekend's RPC meeting is provided below.

1. Amendments to the draft RPC guidelines
  - a. Change from: every Catholic school in the region providing an ex-officio member, to: each school invited to have a representative at each meeting. The school APREs will be the contacts between the RPC and each school.
  - b. Inclusion of a minimum attendance at a meeting (5 members including the priest) in order to make major decisions/move motions.
2. The current term of the RPC is drawing to a close. All nominated members stand down. Nominations for the next term to be made during July. Commissioning of new members to occur in August.
3. Review of Mass Roster. Limited feedback received. No amendments made. Next review scheduled for 12 months time.
4. Discussion about communication improvements, especially increasing the number of people viewing the Facebook page and the possibility of changes to the Bulletin.
