First Reading:Sirach15:15-20He never commanded anyone to be godless.Responsorial Psalm:Psalm118:1-2,4-5,17-18,33-34	Recently I have joined with the Rockhampton Catholic RCIA team as they accompany several people on their journey of discernment and discovery. The diversity of their backgrounds, ages and experiences is a reminder for me of the late Pope Benedict XVI's insight that "there are as many paths to God as there are people." While theirs is a structured journey at this time, it is useful to remind ourselves that we too continue on our journeys of discernment and discovery, both as individual Christians, and together as a Christian community. The discernment of the interior movements of the heart is what Christ speaks of in today's Gospel. To the admonitions of anger and lust, we could very well add the seductions of power, pride, a myopic focus on wealth and selfish pleasure; as all of these can act as the kindling for those destructive actions which harm individuals and undermine the sanctity and stability of families. Christ calls for us to acknowledge the ends to which unchecked anger and lust may lead. To discern then within our own interior forums is to recognise what is happening within ourselves, so that in discovering the motivations, patterns and influences of our emotions and feelings, we might quench the kindling and so avert the potential blaze.
