Professional learning focused on the important issue of Compliance across various areas in school operations. I am aware of the significant preparation undertaken to tailor structured modules specific to CEDR which certainly provided relevant and detailed information to assist Principals and CEDR Managers in their leadership roles. Sincere thanks to Mark Effeney (Assistant Director: Administration) and all who have assisted in bringing together these high calibre professional development days.

A highlight of the gathering was the launch of our new *Leaders' Wellbeing Program*, an initiative aimed at supporting and promoting the health and wellbeing of all leaders within CEDR. We have partnered with Ford Health to deliver this comprehensive program to maintain and improve the health and wellbeing of our leaders by investing in a combination of proactive and responsive initiatives. My sincere thanks to Stephen Dale (Assistant Director: Schools – Southern Region) for leading the introduction of this Program and to Trinity Daley (School Support) for her great support. Last week saw the finalisation of an extensive re-roofing project involving eight schools, boarding facilities at The Cathedral College, and the Catholic Education Office. Commencing mid-2021, the project involved complex coordination from negotiating insurance claims to delivering onsite construction in live school and work environments. The project was expected to take three years and has been delivered in close to half that timeframe. My sincere thanks to the CEDR Building Services Team, and in particular, Brendan McCosker, for his skilled coordination of logistics and to all who contributed to the successful completion of this major undertaking.

In recent weeks, external auditors PwC Australia have worked with finance teams across CEDR to wrap up the 2022 Annual Financial Statement Audit. The external Audit is an important function, providing independent oversight to our financial operations and ensuring our compliance requirements are met. My sincere thanks to Amanda Houston (Assistant Director: Business and Strategy) for overseeing this process with great support from the Finance team. My thanks also to all our finance staff in schools and colleges for your prompt and professional response to audit queries and requests.

I am aware of the great efforts being undertaken in our schools and colleges to support the work of Project Compassion, Caritas Australia's annual Lenten appeal. Our communities have a great tradition of generously participating in this wonderful initiative to help vulnerable communities around the world. Over recent years Caritas has experienced dramatic funding cuts at a time when global need has escalated, so there is an even greater need to do what we can to enable their vital work to continue.
