St Mary's Catholic Primary School

Recently, the St Mary's Year Six cohort was asked to develop a covenant or agreed contract for 2023. This is what they decided upon: St Mary's is our second or third home. It is our community, our voice. There is no normal. So, we are called to celebrate the differences. All are welcome here. This covenant will be used to guide the students in their last year of primary schooling and reflects the Catholic ethos instilled in them during their time with us. Perhaps there is a message for all of us in their words.

Primary schools have their own rhythm of life. Our students come to us at the beginning of the year excited to be back at school and full of life and love. Each ten-week term has its own important events and rituals that mark the passing of time. For our young people, a year is an awfully long time. They will have grown a few centimeters, lose a few teeth, collected a bunch of bumps and bruises, learn a great deal about God's creation, and experienced a number of things for the very first-time including hardship and disappointment. When the disciples asked Jesus who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven, he replied, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." (Mat 18: 3) What does this mean for us?

Lent is a time to pray, fast and give to others. Perhaps we should be childlike in our approach. Perhaps we are called to simplify our lives, to be thankful in prayer for the small wonders of our world, to share our toys, to be happy with what we are given and not ask for more. Perhaps we should pay careful attention to our young people and be prepared to learn their ways all over again. To remember how we viewed the world when we were young.

During the weeks leading up to Easter, students in our Catholic schools will be given many opportunities to fulfill their Lenten obligations. Weekly liturgies will remind us of our calling, classes will be dedicated to supporting Project Compassion, and our prayer life will take on even more special significance. Please take the time to pray for our young people in all schools in Rockhampton. May they celebrate the differences and be welcoming places for everyone.



EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME 2023

Enrolments for this year's program need to be finalised before the 19th March 2023.

All families of the Catholic Worshipping Communities of Rockhampton wishing for their child to participate in the 2023 Sacramental Program are now invited to enrol, please contact the Parish office for more information. Baptised children turning **9 years (or older)** in 2023 are invited to take part. If you have a younger child or one not yet baptised but would like them to be considered, please contact the Parish office 4928 2800 to discuss and to make an appointment with the priest.

The faith journey that leads one to the Sacraments of the Church fosters a deep sense of belonging and a holy relationship with God, family and community in order to carry out the mission of Christ in the World.

WHAT IS RCICCA?

The acronym RCICCA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age. This Rite is intended for children over the age of 7yrs and younger than 14yrs, who have not been baptized as infants, and who wish to be fully initiated into the Catholic church. The RCICCA program follows a similar format as the adult RCIA program but has been adapted for the age of the children.

Canon law prescribes that the children will be initiated and receive all three sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and their First Eucharist) at the same time i.e., during the one mass.

In the Rockhampton parishes, at the moment, we have 12 children who are enrolled in the 6 week RCICCA program and will prepare to receive all three of the Sacraments of Initiation on Pentecost Sunday, May 28 during the 9:00am mass at Holy Family Church.

The RCICCA program is different from the other Parish sacramental program, that you may be familiar with, as the children enrolled in the RCICCA program have not yet been baptised and therefore cannot receive Confirmation of First Eucharist.

This weekend the children in the RCICCA program celebrated the Rite of Acceptance into the program to begin their journey of faith. Please remember them in your prayers.


