

I was delighted to spend some time at The Haven at Emu Park on Monday with our 24 participants from all regions of the Diocese who attended the *Laudato si'* Retreat. These formation days provided an opportunity to explore ecological spirituality by engaging with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and biblical perspectives, as well as Pope Francis' *Laudato si'* encyclical.
