Later today, I will join Bishop Michael and the school community at St John the Baptist Catholic Primary School for the Blessing and Opening of redevelopments that have taken place at the school over the past couple of years. Congratulations and sincere thanks to all involved in this significant capital project which supports St John's transition to a full four stream school in response to continued demand from local families choosing a Catholic education for their children. We ask God to bless in abundance the St John's community.

On Wednesday of this week, we learnt of the appointment of Allan Blagaich as the new Executive Director of the Queensland Catholic Education Commission. On behalf of Catholic Education in the Diocese of Rockhampton, we warmly welcome Allan to this role. I look forward to working with him to advance the best interests of the Ministry of Catholic Education in Queensland.

I share with you an update <u>(read)</u> provided by the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) regarding the ongoing challenge of religious freedom for faith-based schools. It details concerning threats to the rights of parents to choose a faith-based school for their children and the right of faith communities to continue to teach and operate faith-based schools. It is important for us to have an awareness of these issues and I ask that we pray together for the protection of our faith communities and the freedoms that are fundamental to our way of life in Australia.
