Good morning everyone

It has been wonderful to see the extraordinary images of World Youth Day 2023 shared by our diocesan pilgrims. We have witnessed scenes of joy and celebration as Catholic young people from all over the globe have gathered with enthusiasm and energy, united in faith. I am certain the experience of attending Mass led by Pope Francis for an estimated 1.5 million pilgrims in Lisbon, Portugal, will be a memory that lasts a lifetime. We look forward to the safe return of our 17 diocesan pilgrims and hearing more about their World Youth Day experiences.

Next Tuesday (15 August) is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics and evidence of the special place Mary holds in the Catholic faith tradition. The Assumption recalls the end of Mary's earthly life when, according to our faith, Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heavenly glory. We honour Mary and her great example of how to live a life of faith and service to God.

The Year 11 ACTS (A Chance to Serve) Camp at the Capricorn Coast this week saw 75 students from across the Diocese gather with facilitator David Jorna from Project Hatch to reflect, to share experiences and to explore their spirituality. Friday 18 August 2023

A national commemorative service will take place in Canberra on Friday 18 August 2023 recognising the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War. The service will take place on Vietnam Veterans' Day (18 August) at the Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial on Anzac Parade in Canberra and will be broadcast nationally by the ABC. Some 60,000 Australians served in Vietnam which was the longest conflict Australia was involved in during the 20th Century. More than 3,000 Australians were wounded and 523 lost their lives during the Vietnam War. The broadcast will commence at 10:00am.
