

## Friday 20 October 2023

Good morning everyone

Due to very low participation rate and the close result in the ballot for a new Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA), I advised you recently that a re-ballot will be conducted for eligible staff to vote again on the proposed EBA. The negotiations with the Independent Education Union Australia (IEUA) on this EBA, as you know, have been long and protracted. I give you my personal assurance that I have listened very attentively to issues raised by the IEUA and I have endeavoured to respond in a positive and meaningful way to address the issues they put forward. At all times, I have conducted these negotiations in good faith and with my overriding objective being to provide the teachers and support staff who work in our Catholic schools with an attractive package of remuneration and workplace benefits which appropriately recognise and reward their outstanding work.

I have always been respectful of the role played by the IEUA leadership and their schoolbased representatives and my hope has always been to work constructively with the Union to deliver the best possible outcomes for our staff. I sincerely believe that the proposed EBA we are once again putting before you to consider and vote upon is fair and just and provides our valued staff with significant and meaningful remuneration increases and enhanced working conditions. If I did not believe that to be the case, I would not be placing the proposed EBA before you again for your respectful consideration. I had hoped that the IEUA would recognise our strong commitment to the welfare of our teachers and support staff that underpins this EBA and the real benefits, including back pay, that will flow to them as soon as possible if the proposed EBA is approved. Accordingly, I hoped that the IEUA would encourage a YES vote by their members in this re-ballot but regretfully and disappointingly that appears not to be the case.

**October Month of the Rosary:** By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7). (Excerpt from Teaching Catholic Kids) **What is the Rosary?** The Rosary is a method of prayer, which involves contemplating the mysteries, or scenes, of the life of Jesus, through the eyes of his mother, Mary. This contemplation is the heart of the Rosary. Contemplation is a form of praying in which we think about, mull over, and meditate on the specific scene. We put ourselves in the scene and make it present to us. It's a way of praying to immerse ourselves in the life of Jesus and listen to what he wants to teach us.
