The Mass of Chrism will be celebrated at St Joseph's Cathedral in Rockhampton on Thursday, 21 March at 10:00am. Bishop Michael has invited all in the Diocese to attend this solemn occasion in person or via livestream, to witness the *Blessing of Oils* as we journey towards Easter. I would encourage school communities to consider participating in this important Mass which holds such sacred significance in our Catholic tradition.

The Chrism Mass coincides with the annual gathering of all our priests in the Diocese, and I ask that you join with me in praying that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide and strengthen our priests in their ministry.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) test window commenced this week and continues until 25 March.
