Media Consent Reminder:

Media Consent informs our school communities of how image of students can or cannot be used. For example, some families are happy for student photos to be published in the newsletter but not on social media. All schools received information and directions regarding this in Circular 2023-170 Parental Consents.

TASS is now recording a record number of because NON-Media Consents student information has not been updated by Parents or Carers. It is VERY important that families are reminded that failure to renew media consent has now automatically defaulted to NO which limits the ability of schools to share stories in pictures for all media and photo opportunities for 2024. This will also have an impact on deidentified data reporting which will affect school results in several areas.
