LEARNING MORE ABOUT THE MASS: THE CREED

Have you ever wondered why we say the Creed every Sunday (except when we renew our baptismal promises at Easter)?

One key word at the start of the Creed sheds light on the weekly Profession of Faith at Mass. That key word is "believe."

Belief can be something intellectual. For example, in the Creed, we affirm our belief that there is "one God." that Jesus is "the Only Begotten Son of God" who died and rose again on the third day. We also believe in "the Holy Spirit" and "one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church."

On the other hand, belief can literally mean to take one's stand on something else. In other words, from the biblical perspective, belief in God does not simply express an intellectual conviction that God exists. It also entails a personal entrusting of one's entire life to God. Just as married couples may affirm their trust and commitment to each other regularly and tell each other over and over again, "I love you," so do we in the Creed renew our commitment to the Lord each week, lovingly telling him over and over again that we surrender ourselves to him, that we want him alone to be the foundation of our lives—that we "believe" in him. This is why we recite the Creed every Sunday at Mass.

While the Creed is not directly from Scripture, it summarises the story of the Bible: moving from creation to Christ's incarnation, death, and resurrection, the sending of the Holy Spirit, the era of the Church, and finally Christ's second coming at the end of time, the Creed carries us through the entire story of salvation history - from Genesis to the book of Revelation, with a keen eye on the three divine Persons who are the principal actors in this drama; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As one theologian has commented, "What the Scriptures say at length, the Creed says briefly."

Either the Apostles' Creed or Nicene (full title: Nicaeno-Constantinopolitan) Creed can be said, with the Apostles' Creed commonly said during the Lent, Easter, Advent and Christmas seasons and the Nicene Creed in Ordinary Time.
