NEW TESTAMENT COMMENTARY by Mary Coloe PBVM A seed sprung to harvest John 12:20-33

Unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies it remains only a single grain; But if it dies, it vields a rich harvest.

Lazarus has been raised from his tomb. Jerusalem has welcomed Jesus as the royal son of David and now a group of non-Jews from outside Palestine come to Phillip looking for Jesus. Here is the final indication that Jesus' mission is drawing to its close. When Jesus hears about the Greeks he knows, 'Now the hour has come.' Why is this?

John is drawing on the Old Testament, particularly Zechariah 8 where the prophet proclaims that in the last days, foreigners would come to Jerusalem seeking salvation. 'Many peoples and strong nations shall come to seek the Lord of hosts in Jerusalem . . . In those days ten men from the nations of every tongue shall take hold of the robe of a Jew. saving. "Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you." (Zech 8:22-23) With the coming of the Greeks Jesus realises that the last days have begun.

Using the image of the seed and its harvest, Jesus then reminds his disciples that the glory promised in these last days will only be achieved through the hour of death and resurrection. There is no side-stepping the cross, even though Jesus is distressed as it approaches. The parable of the seed dying and its rich harvest reminds me of our own Foundress, Nano Nagle, who died leaving only three sisters in the congregation, but said to this small group, 'Be assured my sisters, it will surely flourish."

It amazes me sometimes that people have few qualms about taking great risks in life about many things - the risk in buying a new house, of investing in the stock-market, of committing oneself to this person. In these matters risks are taken with a hope that in the future these risks will be justified by the rewards they bring. Yet sometimes the risk of faith is seen as too much. It seems to me that taking risks is just part of being human when we cannot see into the future. When we plant seeds we cannot see in the seed the oak that will shade others one hundred years later, but we still plant the seed, for its future promise.

Jesus is prepared to risk, to plant the seed of his own life in the ground of his relationship with God. And yes, this is a costly risk and his soul is troubled. But he has faith to speak of the bountiful harvest that will result.

God of the bountiful harvest, grant us the courage to risk placing our lives in your hands.

The letter to the Hebrews resonates with the gospel image of Jesus' anguish as he faces the consequences of his preaching and actions. Jesus does not want to die but in fidelity to the God he knows and his mission he is willing to pay even this price. In this he reminds me of other women and men who, knowing the consequences of their actions, continue resolutely in the path of justice and what Christians call the values of God's reign. I think of Oscar Romero, of Aung San Suu Kyi, of Mahatma Ghandi, Benazir Bhutto. We may never be called up to face such dire consequences, but in the daily-ness of our own life commitments to people and to work there is a very real discipline. Perhaps this week we might take note of the times when being faithful to our relationships, to work, to colleagues is not easy and calls for generosity and self-giving.
