Good morning everyone

This week I am delighted to share news of great collaborations with a couple of Queensland universities delivering valuable professional development opportunities for staff.

Firstly, more than 60 staff from our schools and colleges, together with colleagues from other Queensland Dioceses gathered for our 2024 Catholic Identity Gathering facilitated by Australian Catholic University (ACU) theology academics, Dr Teresa Brown and Associate Professor Robyn Horner. APREs and members of Catholic Identity teams attended the five-day intensive face-to-face program, focussed on the unit *THCT605: Introducing the Leuven Project*.

The course explores contemporary theology in the area of Catholic school identity, which was introduced to CEDR in 2015. Through our wonderful association with ACU, we are delighted to host the first offering of this unit of study in a regional area. Sincere thanks to Kellie Jenkinson (Assistant Director: Mission), Derek Worden (Catholic Identity and Formation Coordinator) and the FIARE team for preparing and presenting this valuable in-service for participants.

In a recent collaboration with CQUniversity, Carmel Kriz (Assistant Director: Teaching and Learning) hosted an information session about courses and programs the university are currently offering that may be of interest to our staff. The 30-minute Zoom presentation was recorded and is now available on our staff portal (link). The opportunity for further study ranges from micro-credentials (short mini courses) to Diploma and Masters level courses, to pathways for Teacher Assistants to receive credit towards teaching qualifications. Special thanks to Associate Professors Rickie Fisher and Gillian Busch for sharing details about these study opportunities and to Carmel for facilitating this important collaboration.

All schools would have received communication regarding celebrations marking the 10-year anniversary of Bishop Michael's Episcopal Ordination on Wednesday, 29 May at St Joseph's Cathedral, Rockhampton. Celebrations include our Catholic Education Thanksgiving Liturgy (livestream) at 10:00am and later at 5:30pm the Diocesan Celebration Mass followed by an evening reception to be held at The Cathedral College Mercy Centre. 

## LATEST 2024 COST OF **NEWS LIVING PAYMENT**

As you will recall, EB10 provides for a COLP each financial year when the relevant CPI figure exceeds the wage increase. For the 2023/2024 financial year, the wage increase was 4% (from 1/7/23 for teachers and 1/5/23 for other staff); and the relevant CPI figure is 3.4% (as published by the ABS on 24/4/24). In accordance with the COLP EB10 provisions, a COLP will not be made this year as the wage increase exceeds the relevant CPI figure.
