THE LORD'S HEALING HANDS

Healing is one of the important ministries of Jesus. It was through miracles that the Lord healed people. Today's Gospel gives us the reflection on Jesus's healing ministry. There were many people crowded around Jesus, waiting to be healed. The people went to the Lord with expectation and faith and experienced healing.

The Gospel of Mark gives us five important aspects to be reflected:

- 1. The faith of the people. The people had tremendous faith in the healing power of God. People crowded around Jesus with faith, because they wanted to experience the healing power of God.
- 2. The people had come to him with a great and very specific expectation. They wanted to be healed from the Lord from physical, emotional, mental and healing of broken relationships. So, they had come to him with great expectations.
- 3. They had experienced the actual healing. When the healing power of the Lord came out of him, and they experienced the personal transforming effect in their life of healing and cleansing.
- 4. The healing and cleansing as we heard in today's Gospel, the Lord gave them a blessing, the blessing of peace.
- 5. Lastly the thing which happened in their life was that they went back with a profound gratitude to God.

We approach the Lord with faith and expectation and experience the healing power of Jesus. Let God touch us, and the power of healing come out of the Lord and transform us in and through healing.
